DIFFICULTY

Medium - It is actually an easy snorkel but the water is very cold

VISIBILITY

Known for their clarity the pond visibility can be as much as 80 metres



GETTING THERE

EKilsby Sinkhole is located on private property 15 minutes south of Mount Gambier in southeast South Australia. Mount Gambier is about 5 hours from both Melbourne and Adelaide.

The last few kilometres of the drive to Kilsby Sinkhole is on a dirt road which is suitable for 2wd cars.

LOOK FOR

- Freshwater turtle
- Rays of light
- Small cave
- Birds nesting in the walls

BEST TIME TO SNORKEL

You can only snorkel at Kilsby during designated tours which generally run late morning and early afternoon. If you can do the snorkel on a sunny day you will see the sinkhole at its best as the rays of light shine through the water.

Kilsby Sinkhole is not affected by tides or wind conditions.
