

Busselton Jetty Snorkel

The Busselton Jetty is perfect for snorkelling and diving, featuring vibrant coral and plenty of marine life. In 2023, a Sculpture Trail with submerged artworks was added, spanning 200 meters. Highlights include a diver's helmet, lighthouse, shipwreck, and mermaid, viewable from the surface or underwater.

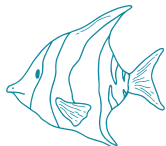

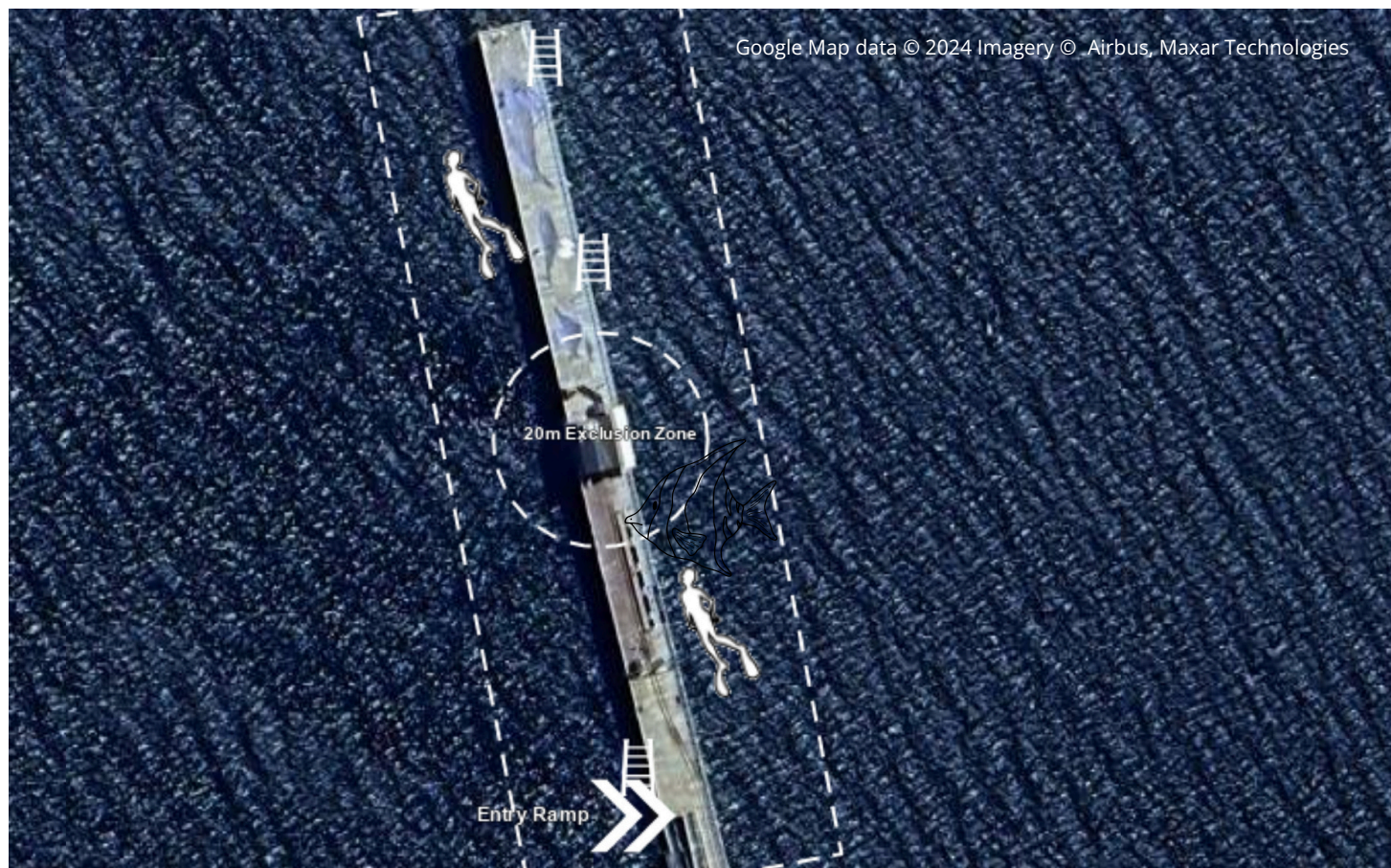

DIFFICULTY

Easy

The Jetty is 1.8km long and you can walk out or catch the train. The further platform along the Jetty has a ramp access.



GETTING THERE

Busselton Jetty is in the centre of town, and an easy walk from the esplanade. The jetty itself is 1.8km long (Longest timber piled jetty in the Southern Hemisphere), and you can opt to walk the jetty for a \$4 fee, or ride the iconic train for a \$16 return fee. Tickets can be purchased onsite at the information building at the entrance to the jetty. Alternatively you can swim the length of the jetty for free.

BEST TIME TO SNORKEL

We found summer was the preferred time to visit, as winds were low and water temperatures high.

Best conditions can be found after a consecutive days of low wind, under 10 knots and low swell. It is recommended to snorkel on a sunny day as overcast days limit the colours visible.
